



# Camp Cory 2010 Information

## When August 23-26, 2010

- Monday arrival time is **9:45 am** at the Meigs St. parking lot. We leave at **10:00am**.
- Thursday we return to church by **2:00pm**. Return drivers need to be at Camp by **11:30am** for loading cars.

## Where Camp Cory on Keuka Lake (near Penn Yan)

- Camp Cory is a YMCA camp that has beautiful facilities including, cabins, boathouses, waterfront, tennis courts, basketball court, craft cabin and more.
- The camp staff provides meals and waterfront supervision.
- Travel time from church is approximately 1-1/4 hours.

## Who Children's Choirs and directors from four area churches participate in the camp.

*Third Presbyterian Church, St. Thomas Episcopal Church, Christ Church Pittsford, and Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Fairport.*

- Youth (10-12 grade) from the churches serve as counselors at camp. Youth (8-9 grade) serve as Counselors-in-Training and participate in work and mission projects around Camp Cory.

## Goals of Camp

- *Community:* Build friendships among our children and youth and relationships with adult leaders, Becky, Jane, Chris and chaperones.
- *Educational:* begin working on choir music for the year and learn various skills, including handbells, Orff percussion, recorder, drama and more.
- *Spiritual:* the children and youth lead and participate in Morning and Evening Prayer each day.
- *FUN:* daily activities include soccer, kickball, fishing, tennis, swimming, boating, crafts, camp fires, boondoggle, "Capture the Flag." water balloons, skits, ice cream cake, dancing, etc.

## Closing Celebration

On Thursday, the last day of camp, at 10:30am there is a closing camp celebration. During this time the children and youth share what they have learned during the week. All parents and friends are invited to attend this celebration.

Please be on time with checks and forms. There are many registrations to process.

## Scholarship Procedures

Scholarships are available for those children who need financial aid. There is a scholarship application that must be filled out and submitted by July 1. All scholarships will be approved by Becky, Chris and Jane Carden. Scholarships are partial; some payment is expected from every camper.

## Forms should be sent in to Chris Lenti by July 16th.

1. Medical Form
2. Registration Form including cabin information (Elective sign-up will be sent out later)
3. Parental release and Consent form/Youth Covenant

**Medications** must be in the original packaging, with clear directions marked. They should be given to the driver when the children arrive on Monday and the driver and child will need to check in immediately with the nurse when they arrive at camp. Medications will be returned to the child on Thursday.

**Behavior expectations—these rules are for the safety and welfare of all campers.**

- Campers are expected to participate in and be on time for all instructional and recreational activities.
- Campers are expected to care for the camp property.
- Campers must use appropriate language at all times.
- Campers may not be by the waterfront except at the designated swimming and boating times.
- Campers must always be with a friend or counselor and may not wander alone around the camp site.
- No video games, CD players, iPods, radios, cell phones or other electronic devices are allowed at camp.
- Campers must wear shoes at all times, flip flops are great for night time bathroom runs.
- Campers may not be out of the cabin after “Lights Out” unless accompanied by a counselor. After “Lights Out” trips to the bathroom or nurse must be supervised by a counselor.
- Inappropriate behavior may result in a phone call to parents, supervised cabin time or in extreme cases, being sent home.

**Packing List**

All medications need to be given to our Camp nurse, along with written instructions.

A bunk bed and mattress are furnished for each camper, so bring:

**A sack lunch for the first day of camp.**

A pillow and either a sleeping bag or bed roll.

Bathing suit(s)

Water shoes and/or flip/flops

Raingear

At least 2 pairs of shoes (in case one gets wet)

Toilet articles (toothbrush, deodorant, shampoo, soap, etc.)

Pajamas, underwear, etc.

Jeans

Shorts

Sweatshirt and Jacket

Towel, washcloth and plastic bag for wet things

Flashlight

Snacks in plastic containers

Optional: Tennis racket, camera (disposable) baseball mitt, fishing equipment, fan

**DO NOT BRING:** Cell phones, radios, stereos, iPods, electronic games and other electronic devices, tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, etc. (as per camp regulations)
