### About Today's Music

NOTE: The postlude today is by contemporary English composer Simon Preston, and is based on a text from the Orthodox Liturgy of St. James. In this piece, the predominant and repeated rhythmic figure derives from the word Al-le-lu-y-a (pronounced as a 5-syllable word). This figure is evident from the opening pedal notes, and is repeated over and over in the main body of the piece, taking on almost jazz-like qualities. The hushed central section, played on the quiet celestes, is likewise built on the same 5-note figure. The closing section recalls the jazzy feel of the opening of the piece and builds relentlessly ("as with ceaseless voice they cry") to the final measure, where the brilliant solo trumpets declaim a different rhythm, evoking the final words of the text, "Lord most high."
